A man at my parish was struggling to overcome a habitual sin. He said to me, "Father, I know the chance that I will commit sin again is really high. Why should I keep confessing my sins?

Isn't that dishonest?" Anyone who has felt the tyrannical power of sin — and who hasn't? — has pondered this kind of question.

I responded to him, "What was the probability Peter would walk on the stormy water?" After some silence, he said, "Zero. But when Jesus called, he did it." I could tell my penitent friend was re-framing the question from his own weakness to the greatness of the Lord's love for him. The question for us should not be one of human probabilities about our sin, but rather whether or not we will trust the Lord's grace in our lives.

This week the Lord is calling you and me to do the impossible: overcome sin with love. The only way to do that is to trust he is calling, and then to walk with the eyes of faith locked on him. And if we sink, he will raise us up again and again. Of that, we can be 100% sure.

From the Desk of Fr. Kevin: Dear Parishioners, "Take courage, it is I; do not be afraid"

Peter's Courage and Boldness

I just love Peter. In so many ways he characterizes all of us. He is a man of action, never content to sit idle and let an opportunity pass him by. You might call him rash, but if you don't try something new every once in a while, you will find yourself doing the same thing out of habit.

Many will focus on Peter sinking, but I want to focus on the courage it took to just get out of the boat. I can only imagine the fear and anxiety of the disciples. Many of them were not fishermen, so they were not accustomed to the sea. Perhaps some of them didn't even know how to swim. Peter, however, made his living on the sea, so a few waves are not going to scare him. Matthew recounts that there was wind and waves. It is also during the fourth watch, which would have been between 3 AM and 6 AM. There must be enough light to see, either from the moon or the rising sun, because they can see a figure coming toward them. Dark, windy, waves are battering the boat and this ghost-like figure is coming toward them. No reason to fear, right?

Jesus encourages them not to be afraid. Peter, mustering his courage, takes it a step further. If it is you, command me to come to you. Is it a ghost? Is it a trick of his mind? Or, is it really Jesus? Command me to come to you! Not calm the storm. Not save us from sinking. For Peter, it is I want to be with you. I want to do what you are doing. I want to be like you. Command me, Jesus!

Jesus commands Peter to come, and he does not hesitate. He sits on the gunwale of the boat, throws one leg over, then the other and steps out onto the water. Peter's courage, determination and his faith allow him to walk on water. We must give credit where credit is due, Peter is the only "regular" person to ever walk on water. That is an amazing miracle. Yes, he falters, but don't we all. That's why we love Peter. The Lord picks him up when his faith weakens and his courage is lacking. Jesus will do the same for us as well, so take courage and step out of the boat. **Peace and Blessings, Tim**



The Eucharistic Miracles Display is a traveling museum-like exhibition featuring the Eucharistic Miracles as chronicled by Blessed Carlo Acutis (1991-2006).

Blessed Carlo was a teenager from Italy who developed a website dedicated to the documented and scientifically scrutinized occasions when the Holy Eucharist changed in its physical appearance, reminding us that the bread and wine of the Mass truly become the Body and Blood of our Lord Jesus Christ.

The Eucharistic Miracles Display will travel across the diocese and can be hosted by a parish or Catholic organization as part of the Diocesan Eucharistic Revival. The exhibit is free, but free will donations are always welcome to continue adding to the collection. All are welcome!
