And we also continually fail to embrace our sufferings with trust in Jesus. We know the truth of the creed, but we easily scorn the weight of the cross.

The good news is that, like Peter, we are never abandoned by the Lord even at our worst moments. Peter will eventually learn the beauty of the cross when he is willingly crucified. But it took time for him to get there. And it takes time for us, too. This week let's not be too shocked at these divisions in our hearts but accept them and patiently seek to be more obedient to Jesus' cross-shaped plan for us.— Father John Muir



September 8th marks the beginning of the life of a woman who would play an instrumental role in the salvation story and whose virtues continue to inspire us today. **The Nativity of the Blessed Virgin Mary** is a feast that holds

a dual significance. On one hand, it celebrates the physical birth of Mary, daughter of Saints Joachim and Anne, a birth that was divinely ordained to prepare the way for the coming of Christ. On the other hand, it is a celebration of the dawn of a life marked by sanctity, purity, and unwavering devotion to God.


The story of Mary's birth is not explicitly mentioned in the New Testament, but it has been preserved through ancient Christian traditions and writings. It is said that Saints Joachim and Anne, a devout and childless couple, were visited by an angel who announced to them that they would conceive a child. This child would be consecrated to God's service from her infancy and would eventually become the vessel through which our Savior, Jesus Christ, would enter the world.
