I confess that I have a soft spot for the scary things Jesus says because they are usually ignored. But there's gold in them thar hills, if we have courage to look. This week, Jesus gives us terrifying warning in His a

parable about the king who gives a marriage feast for his son and promptly goes berserk when people don't respond. The point: those who do not properly respond to God's generous invitation will face totally devastating consequences. The invitees who don't show up get their city burned to the ground. The poor homeless man is tortured for not wearing the correct clothes. Scary indeed.

Is Jesus trying to intimidate or bully us into following Him? No. because that is certainly not how He treats anyone in the Gospels. A better view is this: to Jesus, your life matters. The universe is not an empty wasteland where anything goes. It is a theater of love offered and either accepted or rejected. How easy it can be to glide through life thinking my life doesn't make a difference. But it does. It really does.

This should not only be sobering but exhilarating. The positive side of the negative in Jesus' scary parables is the thrill and joy that He is inviting us, therefore our lives matter a great deal. There is a reason to get up in the morning. God's generous love is relentlessly calling us. True, obstinately saying no through our indifference is a catastrophe for us and those around us. But how wonderful must the consequences of our "yes" be?

The Honor of the Divine Name

Every month at St. Justin Martyr, we celebrate Holy Name weekend by reciting the Holy Name pledge. While it may seem

a little odd to have everyone in the parish recite a



pledge to an organization, I find the pledge to be a great prayer that

every parishioner from two to ninety-two can learn from.

Recently, I have been contemplating on the words, "In honor of His Divine Name, I pledge myself against perjury, blasphemy, profanity, and obscene speech." These words really drive at the purpose of the Holy Name Society, which is to promote devotion to the Holy Name of Jesus.

This line in the pledge is really an emphasis on the Second Commandment. "You shall not take the name of the Lord in vain." The commandment prescribes respect for the Lord's name. It is very easy to overlook the importance of the Lord's name.

When God appeared to Moses in the burning bush, God revealed himself as "I am who I am," but when the Son of God was born in Bethlehem, He was given a name like you and me. He was given a human name because He became human, but He still retained His divinity. God, in His humility, gave us a name to call Him. By allowing us to pronounce His name, Jesus, God offers us a level of trust and intimacy that never existed until that first Christmas.

In the Catechism of the Catholic Church (CCC 2143), we are taught that because the Lord's name is holy, we must not abuse it. We are cautioned to keep the name of Jesus in our minds in silent, loving adoration. We should only pronounce the name, Jesus, except to bless, praise and glorify the name.

In a world where words are often spoken carelessly, and where the sacred is sometimes taken for granted, we need to remember the profound significance of the Divine Name, Jesus. Just as God entrusted us with the privilege of uttering His name, let us reciprocate with trust, intimacy, and devotion. In doing so, we embrace the essence of the Holy Name Society's mission, fostering a deeper connection with the sacred, one heartfelt prayer at a time. **Peace and Blessings, Deacon Tim**






Statement from Bishop Malesic on the conflict in the Middle East | Oct. 12, 2023

May we pray without ceasing that those injured will be healed, those held hostage will be freed, and hearts hardened by hatred will be changed.


