With little more than a year until the United States' national elections, I find myself feeling, like many Catholics, both dread and energized. Dread, because our democratic republic can be a messy endeavor and campaigns



a long, nasty, and unedifying slog; energized, because hope for positive societal change can be enticing and engaging. As a pastor, I see similar conflicting attitudes in those whom I serve. How can Catholics best engage our political arena in a way which is truly helpful and worthwhile?

This week's Gospel reading offers wisdom in this regard. Jesus says, "Render therefore to Caesar the things that are Caesar's, and to God the things that are God's." This riddle forces us to answer for ourselves a hidden question: what is the relationship between political and divine authority? Two common, but false, answers lead to mischief. If we answer that the two are equivalent, politics becomes our absolute authority. This happens whenever religion is slave to the state, as in the travesty of the pro-Nazi German Christian movement in the 1930s and 40s. It also usually occurs when there is an official state religion. If we answer that the two are totally unrelated, we end up with an unchecked aggressive secularist state as we often experience now. Thus, religion becomes a weak and private pastime.

What's a better alternative? At our best, Christians hold that political authority does indeed have its own legitimate autonomy but is nested within God's allencompassing authority. Think, for example, of Rev. Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr.'s respect for politics while also being able to criticize unjust human laws because he recognized a higher heavenly law. In other words, Caesar owns politics - and God owns Caesar. So, we should allow Jesus' words to lead us to have a deep respect and willingness to peacefully engage in politics without making that engagement our religion. We bring our faith to bear on our politics knowing confidently that Caesar isn't God - but he is indeed God's.



Honor Your Father and Mother

Our Catholic faith is very rich and deep in its teaching. There is much more to our faith than what we first perceive. That is part of the mystery of our faith. Not a mystery to be solved by a detective, but something that requires

continual contemplation. One example is the ten commandments, we may have learned them in grade school. They come to us from two different books in the Bible. St. Augustine condensed and summarized the commandments into the simple and easy to learn form that we use today.

The fourth commandment is pretty straight forward. Honor your father and your mother. The three previous commandments were directed toward our relationship with God. The fourth commandment serves as a transition to how we are to treat others. It is important to note that God addresses how we are to love others begins by starting with our father and mother. The two people who gave us life, and our primary educators in all things, including the faith, take a preeminent role in our response of love toward others.

How to honor your father and mother certainly changes throughout the course of your life. As children, that mostly meant obeying and treating our parents with respect. As we got older and moved out of the house, honoring took on new meaning as we worked to honor the parental relationship with visits and phone calls. Later in life as their health declined, honoring took on a commitment to care for our parents as we were able.

The Catechism of the Catholic Church dives even deeper into the meaning of what is meant by father and mother. In viewing them as parents having authority over their children, the Catholic Church sees any authority figure as worthy of honor, affection, and gratitude: pupil to teacher, employees to employers, subordinates to leaders, citizens to their country and to those who administer and govern it. This presents its own obvious challenges.

The blessing is that the fourth commandment is the only one that comes with a reward. "That your days may be long in the land which the LORD your God gives you." Respecting the commandment provides not just the spiritual fruits, but tangible fruits of peace and prosperity.

Our Catholic faith reveals a depth beyond our initial perceptions. "Honor your father and mother," stands as a bridge between our relationship with God and our treatment of others, underscoring the significance of showing respect for others beginning with our parents. This honor evolves throughout our lives, from childhood obedience to caring for aging parents. The broader interpretation of this commandment encourages us to honor all authority figures in our lives, acknowledging the challenges it presents. By adhering to this commandment, we not only reap spiritual benefits but also experience tangible peace and prosperity in our lives.



The Feast of St. John Paul II

On October 22, we celebrate the pope who inspired the world! Born Karol Woityla in Krakow, Pope John Paul II became the first-ever Polish pope. He came of age in the early 20th century and lived through both the Nazi and communist occupations of Poland. 


