2nd Sunday of ADVENT

We like to think we are totally free, but the bitter truth is we simply are not. Or better put, our freedom is limited on every side - by governments, corporate giants, physical and mental frailties, genetic shortcomings, and even the boundaries of time and space,

and above all, the burden of our sins and pending deaths. In our day, we are perhaps particularly aware that we are not free to disconnect from the technocratic rulers of the air. If you doubt me, try not paying your internet bill and see what happens. We are not totally free.

It's nothing new, of course. In Jesus' day, everyone felt the crushing weight of the Roman Empire. You can say you're free all you want, but try not paying your taxes to Rome and see what happens.

Once we feel this burden in our own lives - however it comes - we are ready to hear the stunning announcement that commences Mark's gospel, "The beginning of the Gospel of Jesus Christ, the Son of God." It's not a simple perfunctory introduction, but a dramatic announcement of new freedom. The word "gospel" was a political, even military, term. It meant: a great victory has been won and a new king is in charge. This Jesus – not the Roman emperor – is God's son, and He has defeated all that crushes human freedom. It's time to follow Him and be truly free. This week, let's refuse to submit our freedom to false rulers - especially that of sin. And let's rejoice that Christ is coming to make us perfectly free from all our oppressors.


- We welcomed Evelyn Nicole Severino into the Church last weekend through Baptism!



Tools for the Christian Man (and Woman)

Our first ever "Pints with a Priest" was held Monday, December 4. While we had over 30 men present to hear Fr. Chris Cox, his message was so good that I thought I would



share the highlights. The main subject was masculinity and we reflected on what that means and what our culture says about

masculinity. Fr. Chris concluded that real masculinity is shown in Jesus, crucified. It is only in the self-giving sacrifice of ourselves that we can become truly human.



Fr. Chris then went on to show us some necessary tools for living out our faith. As men, we love tools, we do projects around the house so that we can use our tools and justify buying new ones, and living a

Christian life is no different. The first tool he pulled out of his backpack was a Bible. It is important to read and know scripture because "Ignorance of Scripture is ignorance of Christ," quoting St. Jerome. Many of us were brought up with the notion that the Bible was reserved for clergy and religious, but today's Church recognizes our ability to read and discern. It also offers us tools and guides to help us understand what we are reading.

The second tool he pulled out of his backpack was a book on the Saints. I don't have a book of the saints, but I do have an app on my phone from Franciscan media called Saint of the Day. Every day a new saint is presented. We can learn from the saints because they come from all different walks of life. The saints are great models for us in how to live out our lives.

The third tool Fr. Chris presented was the crucifix. He reminded us that this should be in a prominent place in our house and in our lives. It should be a constant reminder of what Christ did for us. And if He did it for us, we need to do the same for others. He did not mean this in a literal sense, but rather that we need to every day die to ourselves and live for others.

A big thank-you to Fr. Chris for sharing his message and to the Holy Name Society that sponsored the event. Remember to keep your focus this Advent by using your tools: the Bible, the Saints and the Crucifix. They will help keep you on track to welcome the Lord when He comes.
