

#### Wise Men See God in the Simple Things

If you're on social media, you probably have seen a meme going around that features this quote: "God has a plan for your life. The enemy has a plan for your life. Be ready for both. Just be wise enough to know which one to battle and which one to embrace."



There were certainly two competing plans for the

Magi: God's and Herod's. And, wise as they supposedly were, it wasn't entirely easy for the Magi to discern which was which.

After all, Herod posed as a friend. He offered the Magi hospitality and kindness. Though the Gospel doesn't say so, he probably flattered them and appealed to every moral weakness he could observe in them. In his palace, they must have felt great physical comfort — rest and tables of plenty on what was an otherwise long and treacherous journey.

But if the Magi were honest with themselves, I'll bet they would have admitted that, regardless of Herod's charm, they felt a gnawing sense of doubt while in his presence. When they looked upon the Christ Child, born in a stable without any of the comforts of the world or protections of wealth, they probably felt the opposite. They probably felt safe. The Magi were lucky enough to have the right plan spelled out for them in a dream, but for the rest of us, it's enough to remember this: God's plan is often the one that leads us to places of great simplicity, great humility and great love. Let's have the wisdom to view power with suspicion, and innocence with admiration.



#### From the Desk of Fr. Kevin,

Dear Parishioners.

Today we celebrate the great Feast of the Epiphany of the Lord, the revelation of God's salvation for all peoples of all times. We are familiar with the story of the Wise Men finding the newborn King with the aid of the star and making their offerings of gold, frankincense and myrrh to the newborn King. Their total response to God's invitation and the difficulties they experienced on their journey also should be familiar to us from our own faith life.

The traditions about the Magi (wise men or kings) say that they were from three different races. They all joined together in seeking the truth. God loved them and revealed to them the fullness of His Truth, Jesus Christ. Many divisions exist in our world: in families and countries, between different religions, economies, races, in the politics of everything, even within us as individuals. Jesus stays with us, inspiring us to live in His justice and build His peace. He moves us to repentance and reconciliation, keeping us steadfast and hopeful in the face of cynicism and despair.

It is good to remember that God gave the Wise Men lots of help on their journey and that God is present with us each step of the way. This grace that makes our response of faithful living possible.


May the blessing of this Epiphany continue to shine:


#### **Christmas is Not Over Yet**

seek the "star" in our lives. What is your source of inspiration, purpose, and direction that will guide you through 2024?



#### Church Talk

Terms from the Catechism of the Catholic Church

**EPIPHANY:** The feast which celebrates the manifestation to the world of the newborn Christ as Messiah, Son of God, and Savior of the world. The Feast of Epiphany celebrates the adoration of Jesus by the Wise Men (Magi) who came from the East to pay homage to the newborn Savior, together with His baptism in the Jordan and the wedding feast of Cana in Galilee.

GOLD: This precious metal was known from antiquity in Israel, as it was imported mainly from southern Arabia and used for coinage. Representing what was beautiful, rich and honorific, gold was offered to the Infant Jesus on Epiphany by the Magi as an acknowledgment of His future kingly role. It is also one of the substances traditionally and properly used for the sacred vessels employed in the Church's worship.

FRANKINCENSE: Fragrant gum resin obtained from trees, particularly several varieties found in Somalia, Yemen, and Oman. This important incense resin was used in ancient times in religious rites and in embalming. It constituted part of the Jewish incense of the sanctuary and is frequently mentioned in the Pentateuch; it was one of the gifts of the Magi to the infant Jesus, symbolizing His future priestly role. It is used today in incense and fumigants and as a fixative in perfumes.

MYRRH: Gum resin used as an ingredient in incense. In ancient times, it was used as a perfume and an embalmer. Myrrh was presented to the Infant Jesus by the Magi on the Epiphany as an acknowledgment of His future suffering and death.

# Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults—RCIA Becoming Catholic

RCIA prepares those desiring to become Catholic by instructing them in the Faith, worship and practices of the Church. It also uses various rites to mark stages toward full union with Christ and the Church. We soon will celebrate the Rites of Acceptance & Welcoming with Rick Wiggins and Terry Rosian. Through the Rites of Acceptance (for the un-baptized) and Welcoming (for the baptized), candidates express publicly their intent to enter into a formal relationship with the Church. The rites take place during the Mass, allowing us as parishioners to welcome, pray for and support those desiring to join our family of faith.


