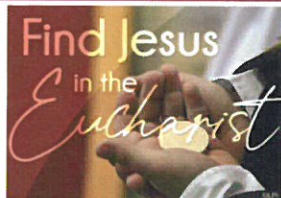

If you witnessed a miracle, wouldn't you want to tell everyone? If you saw the sun dance in the sky, a crippled

man walk, or the Virgin Mary appear in front of you, wouldn't you just want to shout about it from a rooftop so all could hear? Maybe you would be afraid others would not believe you. You might choose instead to keep it to yourself to avoid criticism and ridicule. At least, if you saw a miracle, you would have a choice: to tell or not to tell.

Yet, at every Mass we witness a miracle. We witness bread and wine as it becomes the true presence of Jesus Christ. It isn't a saint or Mary appearing before us; it is actually Jesus! When was the last time you told anybody about that miracle?

It might not be easy for us to always talk about our faith, but we can show them. When we receive the Eucharist into our bodies, we become one with Christ. We go forth from the Mass as a living testimony of the miracle that occurred at Mass. People will not be able to simply look at us and see the evidence. We need to demonstrate to them the reality of this miracle by our good deeds and profound acts of charity. That is stewardship. That is bearing witness to the truth of our God being truly present to us. It is something we should want to share with everyone.

From the Desk of Fr. Kevin,

Dear Parishioners,

*"Come back to me with all your heart.
Don't let fear keep us apart."*

On Ash Wednesday, we turn to the Father, the source of all good gifts. We turn to Him with the hope and joy that comes from our faith in Jesus. We turn to Him with the love of the Holy Spirit. And having turned toward God, we will have the courage to look into our own hearts and be renewed.

Prayer is the lifeblood of our union with God. Each of us needs to take time to deepen our own individual prayer life. But we also need to pray together as the Body of Christ. We celebrate Mass each day of the week. The weekly Stations of the Cross will be on Fridays at 7:30pm. Celebrate the Sacrament of Reconciliation on Wednesday, February 28, evening of Confession on Tuesday, March 12, Lenten evening of Confession at St. Mary Magdalene and on each Saturday here at St Justin.

Grow in your faith by participating in our mission **Living a Eucharistic Life** on March 17 – 19. Join in discussion of the book "This is My Body" with Charles Hunt on Tuesday afternoons and evenings and the Bible Study led by Deacon Tim on Thursday evenings.

Fasting is a wonderful Lenten practice. "Giving something up for Lent" reminds us of our hunger for God even as it helps us see how much we look to other things to "satisfy" us. For many of us, a fast from social media, controversy, the Internet, TV or worry would free up time and attention for prayer and good works.

Almsgiving in Lent is more than generosity. It is a way to shape our lives in accord with what we have learned from God in our prayer and fasting. Can we be more concerned with God's love of the poor and less about our consumer wants? Can we be better stewards of the goods of God's creation? Reach out to those who are far off by giving to the Catholic Relief Services Rice Bowl at home, and the Alms Bowl at church. Help those who are near through support of our Helping Hands Ministry and Catholic Charities.

The Lenten preface says it best: "This great season of grace is Your gift to Your family to renew us in the Spirit. You give us strength to purify our hearts, to control our desires, and so to serve You in freedom. You teach us how to live in this passing world with heart set on the world that will never end."

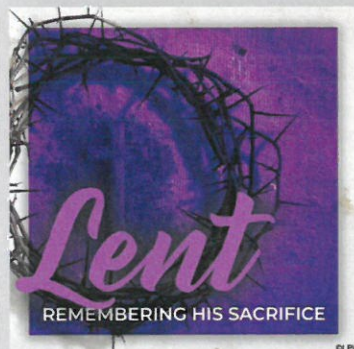

Since February 14 is celebrated by many couples as Valentine's Day, parishioners should consider the need for fasting and abstinence from meat since no dispensation will be given for this day which marks the solemn beginning of Lent.

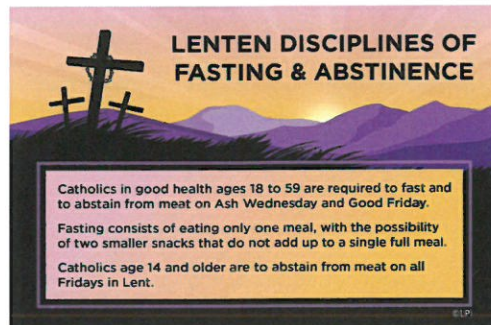

Catholics in good health ages 18 to 59 are required to fast and to abstain from meat on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday.
Fasting consists of eating only one meal, with the possibility of two smaller snacks that do not add up to a single full meal.
Catholics age 14 and older are to abstain from meat on all Fridays in Lent.



Fast – Pray – Give

What are you giving up for Lent? That is a common question among Catholics as we begin our season of preparation to celebrate the great feast of our Lord's victory over death. A more accurate question would be, what are you doing for Lent? While giving something up is a good start, it only hits one of the three focuses of Lent. The season of Lent is really a three-fold time of preparation that focuses on Fasting, Prayer and Almsgiving, and it is important to fully participate in all three.



Starting with may seem to be the easiest one, we are called to fast. This is the giving up part, but if you are only giving up chocolate then I think the Lord may be calling you to more. Fasting is more than just food. In our culture, we have so much in our life that brings us enjoyment. There are so many things that give us pleasure. Fasting is a time for asceticism or self-discipline. What do you do that gives you pleasure that you could do without for the next forty days? What is some habit that you have been trying to break and haven't been successful? Try something new this Lent.

We are also called to pray. I think in this focus of Lent, we are called to do a little more. Hopefully, you already have a practice of prayer. Lent may be a time for you to branch out into new ways of connecting with God through prayer. Consider praying the Rosary or the Divine Mercy Chaplet. Consider praying with Sacred Scripture. The Gospels are a great place to start – if you read a chapter a day, you could read through two Gospels before Easter. The Church has many saints that serve as great examples for us, so you could read about the Saint of the Day from any of the various Saint of the Day sources. Or perhaps God is calling you to quiet meditation or keeping a spiritual journal. Whatever you decide, this can be a great way to explore new ways of conversing with God.

We are called to give alms. Like praying, this should be something new. What is on your heart? What organization or group do you wish to support? Homeless? Victims of Domestic Violence? Homebound? Troubled pregnancies? Hungry? The list could go on and on. This may be a good discussion to have with your family to see where you would like to dedicate your giving.

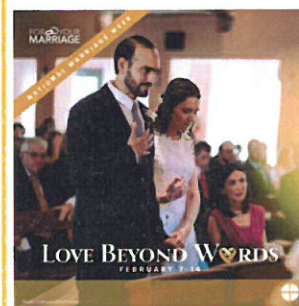
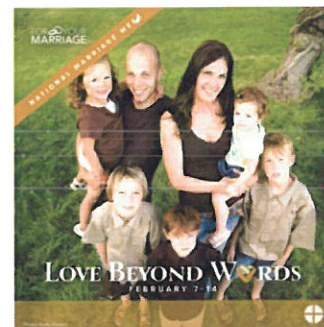


World Marriage Day

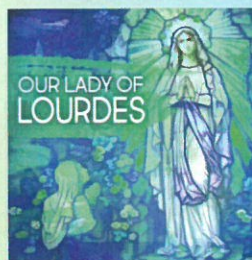
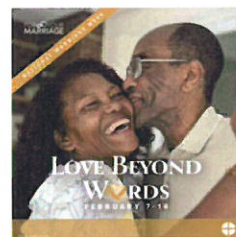
