

1st Sunday of LENT

Have you ever taken a nature walk? Have you leisurely strolled through a forest or field, with no real destination in mind and your only objective being receptivity to and observation of all God's creation?

Sometimes, Scripture readings can feel like a nature walk. All of salvation history plays out against the backdrop of the natural world, with all elements of God's creation — plants and animals and the dust of the earth itself — turning in a supporting performance. How about Jesus in the hot and dusty desert, tempted, living "among the wild beasts?" Noah departed from his ark with the animals he rescued, observing God's sign in the very clouds of the sky. Even God Himself, offering us salvation from original sin through the waters of Baptism.

How often do we remember that God speaks to us through all of His creation, even in the unlikeliest suspects?

Let's go back to the nature walk. It sounds like a lovely way to pass an afternoon, amongst wildflowers and butterflies, but don't forget the beating hot sun, mosquitoes, and threat of rain on the horizon. Remember, we're not in heaven yet. Here on earth, God may be present in His creation, but that doesn't mean it's always easy to endure.

Lent is, essentially, a time to listen for the voice of God in places we may not expect: the mild irritations you experience when you're craving the chocolate you gave up, or the dull pangs of hunger during the Ash Wednesday fast. It's a golden opportunity to see the divine hand in all of creation, even those unlikely suspects.



A Day of Rest

We all know what happened after God finished making the world. On the seventh day, God rested. Why did God need to rest? Was He tired? Did it take all His effort and He just had to kick back in His God-sized La-Z-Boy and rest? The reason why God rested was to make it Holy. By resting on the seventh day, He blessed and made sacred our leisure.


True leisure is not as easy as it sounds. It does require practice and effort. The first step is to begin valuing seemingly idle, modest, human-paced activities – gardening, reading a book, making coffee, watching birds, long meandering walks, and so on. These activities are very different than sitting around in front of a television. They don't distract but, rather, leave us alone with our thoughts. They require a small amount of effort, but allow us to breathe, decompress and just be ourselves.

The other stuff is all just diversions. Social media, television, needless errands, constant activity just to be doing something, all of it continues to pull us away from ourselves. We lose who we are when we waste time with constant distractions, whether they be low-energy or high-energy, it isn't restful.

Visit with family, have tea with friends, watch your children play a sport (just a game or two, and then get ice cream and hang out at the playground), go for a run in the woods, play an instrument, spend time on a hobby, and most importantly, go to Mass.

Let's try to recapture the sacredness of rest. Make a concerted effort to do away with distractions and take some well-deserved rest. Replace the distractions with activities that refresh you. But don't overdo it. Remember that leisure isn't work! It does, however, require effort. The difference is that, when we put effort into our leisure, it rewards us with extra energy.

Eucharistic Adoration is a ministry that has been in existence in our parish for over 25 years! There are currently 38 adorers; some couples.


Eucharistic Adorers spend one hour a week with Jesus, praying, talking, and listening to Him. Would you like to commit to an hour a week?

Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults—RCIA

Becoming Catholic: Today at the 10:30 Mass, we celebrate the *Rite of Sending* for catechumen **Richard Wiggins**. The Rite is a chance for the parish to express affirmation for being chosen (elected) by God and to send him forth to the *Rite of Election*—all with assurance of the Parish's prayerful support. The *Rite of Election* takes place with Bishop Malesic at the Cathedral of St. John the Evangelist, where hundreds gather from the Diocese to be recognized as called by God to enter the Catholic Church. We also celebrate the *Rite of Continuing Conversion* with baptized candidate **Teresa Rosian**. For those who have been baptized, being chosen and claimed by Christ took place at Baptism. They are already among the "elect in Christ." Candidates are "called to continuing conversion," as they journey closer to their full initiation by way of Confirmation and sharing the Eucharist. **Please prayerfully keep in mind our catechumen and candidate.**



Sharing Share the world's energy. Conserve electricity by turning off lights, wearing a sweater, turning the heat down or walking somewhere close instead of driving.






