From the Desk of Fr. Kevin

Dear Parishioners.

"God did not send the Son into the world to condemn the world, but that the world might be saved through him."

It is easy for us, in our deeply divided world, to forget God's view of us. What we see all too clearly are the things that divide us. We tend to believe that these divisions must be as they are. We often fail to see how our sins and those of others transform our differences into these destructive divisions. We often miss the opportunity for repentance, reconciliation and new life.

Some of the Gospel's favorite analogies for faith are "seeing" and "living in the light". The Gospels do not downplay the darkness and divisions of our world but they do want us to experience the grace of God at work overcoming them. We must choose the light, reject the darkness and then we must act. Christ is the true light of the world. By putting our faith in Him, we "come into the light, to make clear that our deeds are done in God."

Lent is the privileged time for reconciliation. How are we being reconciled and reconciling with others?

We are thankful that Fr. Lou Pizmoht can celebrate Mass here again. He is feeling better and will be here for the 10:30 a.m. Sunday Mass several times a month. Thank you for all your prayers.

Please plan to join the parish mission Living a Eucharistic Life led by Fr. John Thomas Lane on March 17-19. Fr. Lane visited the parish to prepare to lead us into a deeper communion with the Lord in the Eucharist. He is excited to be with us. I believe we will be richly blessed by this time of prayer. 
