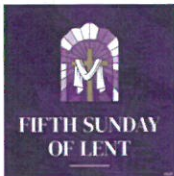

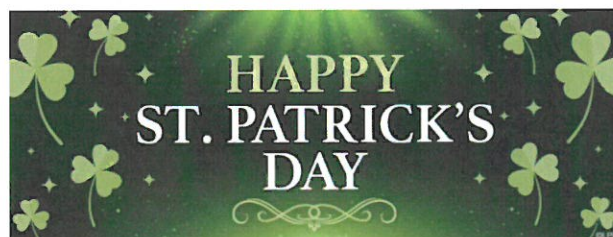

The Real St. Patrick

Our society has a way of taking over holidays and changing them to the point where it is easy to lose the meaning of them. I think that St. Patrick's Day in the United States would be nearly unrecognizable to the patron that bears its name.

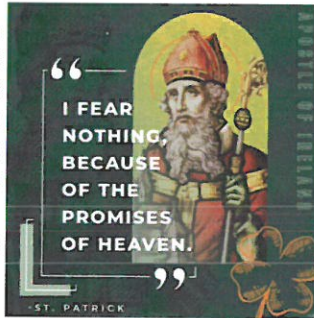
The Real St. Patrick was born in England. While the exact location of his birth is not known for certain, we do know that he grew up in England. At the age of sixteen, he was captured by a band of pirates from Ireland and carried off into captivity to be a slave.

Up until capture and enslavement, St. Patrick had lived a carefree life and was not very religious. His time as a slave caused him to turn to God for consolation and help. While in captivity, he worked as a shepherd and strengthened his relationship with God through prayer, eventually leading him to convert to Christianity.

After six years of slavery, St. Patrick heard a voice telling him that he would soon go home, and then that his ship was ready. Fleeing his master, he travelled to a port, two hundred miles away, where he found a ship and with difficulty persuaded the captain to take him. After some trials and tribulations, he eventually found his way back to his family's home.

A few years after returning home, he had another vision, this time the voice called him back to Ireland. His family tried to convince him not to go, but St. Patrick's calling as the Apostle to the Irish was something he could not deny.

St. Patrick's early life has a few lessons from which we can learn. Strength in adversity, redemption, call to vocation, etc. but the overriding lesson is that God has a purpose for all of us, no matter what the circumstances. No matter what happens, God has a way of making it all work out to fulfill His plans.
