



At Easter, we celebrate that our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ,


conquered death, rose

From the Desk of Fr. Kevin

Dear Parishioners.

The great St. Augustine proclaimed: "We are an Easter people and ALLELUIA is our song!" He captures the new life, new possibilities, new world opened to us by Jesus' death and Resurrection. The old order has passed away, now all is new.

GO OUT AND SPREAD THE GOOD NEWS The Resurrection is our joy. Let us follow the example of those first disciples, men and women, who shared the Good News of the Resurrection with each other and with the whole world. There was confusion and disbelief at first. Wonder and awe at God's love overcame their own shame, guilt and sadness. Finally, confidence in Jesus' presence with them enabled them to begin sharing this new life with others.

With faith, we can see ourselves continuing this process of dying and rising with the Lord in our individual, family and community lives. We are better when we appreciate and use all the gifts God has given us. How is God calling you to live new life in your home, in our parish and in our community?

I want to share with you a special gift we received just before Easter. Mr. Donald Scheid died last June. In his will, he made a bequest of \$15,000 to the parish because he was very grateful for the support and care he received from friends and the parish community. As Easter people, we are fully aware that our life does not end with death but is transformed into eternal life. Don's generous gift will ensure that the prayer and ministries of our parish will help many more people in the years ahead. Will you follow his example for the future of the parish?

At the Easter Vigil, we joyfully welcomed Richard Wiggins to new life with Christ in the Catholic Church and Teresa Rosian to full initiation into the Church by the Sacrament of Confirmation. Charles Hunt and the RCIA team are to be thanked and commended for their part in sharing the Good News.

We give thanks for the musicians, lectors, Eucharistic ministers, servers and ushers who added so much to our Easter celebration. Thanks, too, to those who prepared and decorated the church for our celebrations.

Pledges: \$384,944 Paid: \$353,585 Remaining: \$31,359

Thank you for your generosity and continued support of the Heart of a Shepherd campaign. We received our eleventh distribution check of \$17,507, raising the parish total received to \$215,542.



\$215,542, total St. Justin has received.

HEART OF A SHEPHERD

\$155,840, paid the credit line for the church renovation; improved parish computers and church live-stream system; building repairs; new A/C unit for ATR; the new electronic information sign; extra repairs to the church organ.

\$59,702, balance and future donations are for repainting of the chapel, other capital improvements and adding to parish endowment funds.

The diocesan Heart of a Shepherd initiative received \$138,025. Funds support the renovations at the seminary, the priest retirement fund and the education fund for seminarians.

Generous parishioners pledged a total of \$384,944, \$160,585 beyond the original goal of \$224,359. Now 80% of the funds will come to St. Justin and 20% to the diocesan component. Fulfilling all pledges will mean an additional \$25,087 for St. Justin and \$6,722 for the diocesan component.

RCIA—Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults

Becoming Catholic: The celebration of the Sacraments of Initiation at the Easter Vigil marks the highlight of the spiritual journey for our candidate, **Rick Wiggins**, and baptized candidate **Terry Rosian**. They celebrate with family and our parish their full entrance into the Paschal Mystery of Christ and into the Catholic Church.

The Easter Vigil Liturgy begins with the Service of Light which includes the blessing of the new fire and the Paschal candle, symbolizing Jesus, the light of the World. The second part consists of the Liturgy of the Word with Scripture readings proclaiming Salvation History. Celebration of the Sacraments of Initiation follows when the candidates are presented to the members of the community, who pray for them and join in the Litany of the Saints. After the Litany and prayers for the candidates, the priest blesses the water placing the Paschal Candle into the baptismal water. Those seeking baptism then renounce sin and profess their faith after which each enter the baptismal font, having water pour over them three times with the words, "I baptize you in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit." After the baptism the newly baptized is dressed in a white garment and is presented with a candle lighted from the Paschal Candle. The newly and previously baptized are then confirmed by Fr. Kevin, who imposes his hands on their heads, and invokes the gift of the Holy Spirit. He then anoints them with the oil called Sacred Chrism. The Mass continues in the usual fashion with the Liturgy of the Eucharist. At this point, the newly baptized can participate in the general intercessions, in bringing their gifts to the altar, as well as sharing in the offering of Christ's sacrifice. At the time for Communion, each receives the Eucharist, Christ's Body and Blood, for the first time! Now they are fully initiated into the Church universal and into our parish, St. Justin Martyr.

Please welcome and continue to pray for the newly initiated, Terry and Rick.


