

### **Third Sunday of Easter**

When I was a kid, a friend at my home parish told me, "If you get to Mass by the Gospel reading, it counts!" As a lifelong late-arriver, it's something I have told myself many times, especially in my earlier years as a Catholic. If

the "it counts" is justifiable on a pathetically minimal scale of liturgical legalism, then the Gospel reading today shows how insanely wrong-headed it is, and how helpful it is to re-think the Mass in its light.

The famous "Road to Emmaus" story recounts, on that first Sunday of the Resurrection, the basic two-fold structure of the Mass: Word, followed by Eucharist. Jesus spends a significant period of time with two dismayed disciples, as He connects a wide swath of the Hebrew scriptures with His own suffering, death, and Resurrection. They would later report that this Liturgy of the Word touched their hearts with an inexplicable fire. This Word-induced flame alone is what leads the two disciples to discover Jesus' presence in the "breaking of the bread."

With this in mind, how can we possibly think that the Liturgy of the Word is unnecessary or incidental? The two disciples needed the Scriptures explained to them in order to experience Jesus alive in the eucharistic breaking of bread. Sure, we say, but they had the Risen Jesus. But that's precisely the point: Jesus is risen and accompanies us in both parts of the Mass. Imagine how much our experience of Jesus in the Eucharist would deepen if we (preachers and listeners) took even more seriously that Jesus Himself sets our hearts ablaze with His Word so that we know Him in the Eucharist. That Word-induced fire counts, too!

#### From the Desk of Fr. Kevin

#### Dear Parishioners,

Sometimes I think we are disappointed with the Lord's Resurrection and our sharing in His new life. We want the last words of the story to be, "and they lived happily ever after."

But the last words of our Gospel today are "Penance for the remission of sins is to be preached to all the nations beginning at Jerusalem. You are witnesses of this." We are witnesses who need salvation even as we are charged to bring this Good News to the world. Our lives are really to be lived with Christ. We are His hands, His voice, His compassion and service in the world today. It means sharing in the ministry and cross as well as the Resurrection until the Lord comes again. Then we will all live happily ever after.

As I mentioned last week, Fr. Joshua Cochrac, who will begin his pastoral ministry here in July, paid a quick visit to the parish last week. We will be working out an orientation program here as he continues his ministry at St. Charles Parish in Parma.

#### Some FAQs about the transition:

When there is a pastoral transition, the diocese first appoints the new priest as Administrator. Fr. Cochrac will have all the authority and responsibility to pastor the parish. After a suitable time, he will be appointed and installed as Pastor.

Fr. Cochrac will be living here at St. Justin. I am finalizing my plans and will be living in the Lake County area.

My ordination anniversary is June 8, so planning is underway for a combined 50<sup>th</sup> Anniversary and Retirement celebration on the June 8-9 weekend.

#### Reflections on the Eclipse

We could look on the eclipse as a basic astronomical reality. The Earth goes around the sun, and there happens to be a large rock that goes around the Earth, we call the moon. And so it's inevitable that every so often, that rock – the moon – is going to get in between our view and the sun.



As extraordinary as an eclipse is, it's simply the natural world behaving in the way the one and only God who created it set it up to behave. And I think for most of us, especially after witnessing the event, would have to admit that the eclipse can also remind us of who put all of those things in motion in the first place.

After witnessing the event, the cooling of the warm afternoon, the ever-growing darkness, the apparent odd behavior of the animals, as the eclipse progressed, we began to experience a little wonder and awe. Then finally, when we were cast into the shadow of totality, the wonder and awe grew exponentially. All of the backyard solar lights popped on. The moon, just the perfect size, caused the glow of the solar corona all around the moon. Venus popped out of her midday hiding spot just a bit lower and to the right of the sun. And every direction we looked, it was like sunrise or sunset, a 360-degree spectacle.

Anything that can give us a little jaw-dropping awe and wonder, something that stops us in our tracks, quieting and silencing the din and buzz of everyday busyness, offers us a great opportunity to reflect on God's grandeur. The Eclipse offers us a chance for quiet contemplation. A great way to reflect is to pray Psalm 8. "When I see the heavens, the work of your hands, the moon and the stars which you arranged, what is man that you should keep him in mind, mortal man that you care for him? Yet you have made him little less than the angels; with glory and honor you crowned him, gave him power over the works of your hands, put all things under his feet... How great is your name, O Lord our God through all the earth!" Amen!
