

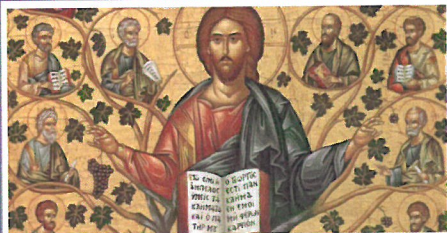

5th Sunday of Easter

My friend and fellow pastor, Father Paul, noticed unsightly, overgrown trees near

his parish church. He asked the maintenance crew to cut back the growth, which they happily did, telling him the trees would be much healthier and even fuller after a good pruning. A few days later, Father Paul received a letter from an irate man in the neighborhood who wrote, "Jesus would never prune trees like that. He loves trees, unlike you."

I suspect that the neighbor was not familiar with this week's Gospel in which Jesus says of His Father, "He removes every branch in me that bears no fruit. Every branch that bears fruit he prunes to make it bear more fruit" (John 15:2) I don't mean to pick too much on that fellow. He was perhaps ignorant of arboriculture. But I'd wager his main confusion was the pruning and removing quality of God's love. That confusion afflicts us all to some degree, doesn't it? It is just so darn easy to react negatively when God cuts something out of our lives and assume it's not His work at all. In the moment, all we see is the loss, and not the loving desire for future flourishing.

The cross is the great pruning of Christ's body. Jesus' rising is the brand-new growth. It is God's promise to us that all the painful pruning in life is leading us somewhere beautiful. What has been cut back or out in your life? A friend, an opportunity, a sense of certainty, a job, health, a relationship? This week, offer those dry branches to the One who lovingly prunes us in order to make our lives burst with verdant growth.

From the Desk of Fr. Kevin

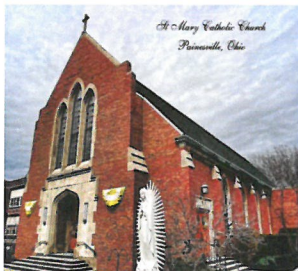
Dear Parishioners,

"I am the vine, you are the branches. Whoever remains in me and I in him will bear much fruit."

In my first parish, St. Mary in Avon, several families were vine growers. They made some wine from their grapes but mostly they sold the fruit to others. They talked about the hard work of pruning the vines, caring for the plants, praying for good weather, dealing with bad weather – all the effort that led up to the harvest. Some harvests were great, some good and some, occasionally, disastrous. Whatever the result, they continued to care for their vines and prepare for the next harvest.

Jesus remains in us so that we may bear fruit, in good times and bad. The love of Christ for us is constant and life-giving. He calls us to love one another as He has loved us. Our words, our deeds, our lives are meant to reveal God's love to the people we meet today so that they may come to believe in Jesus Christ and find abundant life.
