

A Note From Our New Parish Administrator:



In Chapter 55 of the Book of the Prophet Isaiah, God says, "My thoughts are not your thoughts, nor are your ways my ways." I find that this is the case so often. I plan and prepare for one thing, and things turn out differently than expected. This March, I received a call to consider becoming the Administrator of Saint Justin Martyr Parish in Eastlake. It was not something I had thought or planned for, but God had an entirely

different plan from mine. Our Lord always cares for us, and His ways will always outdo our own. I am happy to be here!

I am eager to meet each of you, especially those families who know the stories since the parish's founding. Your history is our shared treasure, and I am excited to delve into it. I am here to become a part of you, not the other way around. As you know, I am coming to St. Justin from St. Charles in Parma, where I have been the Parochial Vicar for four years. I was assigned along with Fr. Chris Cox during my first year-and-a-half. I have worked with Fr. Kevin Fox for the past two years. Both men are from St. Justin Martyr and are grateful for your prayerful support as they discerned priesthood and entered ministry.

I want to take a moment to express my deep gratitude to Fr. Kevin Liebhardt for his 31 years of dedicated service to St. Justin Martyr Parish and 50 years as a Priest in service to the Diocese of Cleveland. His commitment and love for this community are evident, and I am deeply honored to follow in his footsteps. I am grateful for his warm welcome and the care he provided to this community. As he adjusts to his new routine, I ask that you keep him in your prayers. I want to ensure he knows he is always welcome to return to St. Justin, his home.

I am also grateful to Deacon Tim Shell and his wife, Sandi; Beth Rossetti, Charles Hunt, and Tom Gulden, who assist in the role of "pastor" to the people of St. Justin Martyr. St. Justin has an excellent pastoral and support staff, and I will rely on them extensively as I become familiar with the parish.

Will you join me for a bus trip to Detroit on July 19th? We leave the St. Justin parking lot at 8 am and return by 8 pm. One of my favorite people to ask for prayers from is Blessed Solanus Casey. Solanus Casey was noted for often using the phrase "Thank God ahead of time." His feast day is July 30th. Over

Being a Part of the National Eucharistic Revival by Barbara V. Beyer, SJM Parish

When you actually, literally, really and truly walk 15 miles with Jesus and have your very own Road to Emmaus moment, it's a lot to process, but it must be shared. First, the background...

We are in the last year of the three-year Eucharistic Revival declared by the U.S. Bishops. You might remember last year's Eucharistic Procession from St. Justin Martyr to Classic Park for Mass with Bishop Woost as part of this journey. The Revival is an effort to reawaken in every Catholic the firm belief which our faith teaches: that Jesus Christ is truly present - body, blood, soul and divinity - in the Holy Eucharistic. He comes to us in this most special way through the prayers of priests at every Mass said throughout the world each day. It's really HIM!



In mid-July, Indianapolis is hosting the first National Eucharistic Congress in 83 years. (They say these events were held regularly in the past, but obviously none in our lifetime.) It's a huge 5-day event with a fantastic line-up of well-known Catholic keynote speakers, impact sessions, faith-boosting experiences plus praise and worship. (Instead of a huge musical act or sports competition, imagine Lucas Oil Stadium FULL of people attending FOR and WITH Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament for an extended weekend!) I briefly considered attending, but couldn't work out the housing. It was then that the idea of joining up with the Eucharistic Procession wouldn't leave my brain.

On the Feast of Corpus Christi, June 2, four different groups of Perpetual Pilgrims began a historic journey. From Minnesota to the North, Connecticut from the East, Texas in the South and California in the West, four small and dedicated groups began probably the longest Eucharistic Procession our country has ever seen. They are walking (sometimes driving, sometimes even boating) WITH Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament all those many miles TOWARD Indianapolis and will converge there on July 16, just prior to the start of the Eucharistic Congress. It's a huge undertaking that some said could not be done, but Scripture does say that with God all things are possible.





The Eastern route did not come as far north as Cleveland, so I studied the route on their website eucharisticpilgrimage.org. There were Holy Hours, Masses, picnics and portions of the procession open to the public. I work in education and am off for the summer. I'm an avid walker and the Lord has called me into more prayer this summer, so I took the leap of faith and signed up for the 15-mile walk through Beaver County, PA, on Day 31 of the Procession. I drove two hours early in the morning on Monday, June 17 to begin with Mass at St. Blaise in Midland, PA. The church was packed! The procession was very solemn and reverent. We prayed Rosaries, Divine Mercy Chaplets, litanies, sang hymns and kept putting one foot in front of the other all day during the extreme heat. We slowly followed the priest with the monstrance through towns, along main roads, near the Ohio River, passed power plants, up

and down hills and across the Beaver River twice. There were several scheduled pauses to alternate the priests who held the monstrance underneath the canopy that led the way and to swap more pilgrims who joined in for a portion of the walk for those who opted to shuttle back to their starting point.



Organizers said that about 200 walked the entire 15 miles, but a couple hundred more took part for shorter segments. I was impressed and uplifted by the pilgrims of all ages: families with strollers, teens and lots of adults. The priest would stop and turn with the monstrance and we all knelt in adoration on whatever road we were on. People even came out of their houses and businesses to see what was going on and many of those knelt to adore as we went by. That was poignant! We were so thankful for the police escorts who closed roads and monitored our safety the entire journey. The organizers kept us hydrated, too, with what seemed like an endless supply of bottled water and Gatorade. The kneeling and walking all day in the

dangerous HEAT all became quite taxing, but how could we complain when we were WITH Jesus who suffered a cruel passion for our sake. I could not help but think of this. I had the written prayers of my adult children in my backpack as additional motivation and felt the prayers of my extended family and friends who promised to pray for me and the group. Upon completion of the procession, we were all just inside the Chapel at St. Monica Academy in Beaver Falls to begin Benediction when a severe storm hit. It had been sunny all day and we were amazed at God's timing and protection. We soon learned that this same storm caused heavy damage with downed trees, heavy branches broken and a roof blown off a business in New Brighton, on the very streets we had just walked! I saw the damage and closed roads for myself on my Uber ride back to retrieve my car to come home.

It was an intense experience in many ways and I'm very glad that I went. Know that I prayed for our parish and I continue to hope that the witness of the Pilgrims and the fruits of the Revival are felt here and across the U.S. May we all come to know Him in the breaking of the bread! (Luke 24)








Going Back to "Little Bavaria" in Frankenmuth, MI September 11-12, 2024
