1.We are one week away from the Sacrament of Confirmation being celebrated at

Immaculate Conception in Willoughby. Our parish has prayed for the Confirmandi for months now. We ask the Holy Spirit to lead them to proclaim Christ in their lives, wherever they are called to serve.

2. The Red Cross will be here next Sunday from 8 am-2 pm.

3. Perhaps you have heard the news about Fr. Kevin Fox. Fr. Kevin Fox was ordained a priest from St. Justin Martyr in 2019 and has ministered at St. Bernadette in Westlake and at St. Charles in Parma (along with me until I started here). On October 1st, he begins a new ministry in Garfield Heights as the Administrator of two parishes: Ss. Peter and Paul and St. Therese. We offer our prayers for him.





4. In addition, we pray for Fr. John
Chrysostom Kozlowski, OP, who was also
ordained from St. Justin Martyr Parish in 2012.
He is going to be installed as the new pastor of
St. Rose Parish in Girard (Diocese of
Youngstown) on Saturday, September 28th. In
addition to being Pastor of St. Rose, he serves
as the Prior of the Dominicans in Youngstown,
is the Diocesan Director of Formation for

Permanent Deacons in Youngstown and is on the faculty at Saint Mary Seminary in Wickliffe, teaching Canon Law to the seminarians who are preparing to be ordained in the next year or two.

These are just a few examples of ways that some give their lives to Christ and the Church. As my time in El Salvador comes to a close, our travels have led us to see where several martyrs have given their lives to Christ, including some from Cleveland (Sr. Dorothy Kazel and Jean Donovan). Whether we do this in our daily "yes" through our vocation or the ultimate "yes" of our life, we know we are never alone. Christ is always with us.

Seven Sorrows of Mary

Last week, we celebrated Mary's birthday, a joyful occasion, but today we observe a much more somber Marian feast day. On the third Sunday in September, the Church calls us to remember our Sorrowful Mother. Growing up, my family attended Mother of Sorrows Parish in

North Auburn, Ohio. Our parish had a replica of the Pietà, which beautifully captures one of the seven sorrows. We also made frequent pilgrimages to the Sorrowful Mother Shrine in Bellevue, Ohio. These experiences have carved a special place in my heart for our Sorrowful Mother.

When I was younger, I didn't fully understand the depth of Mary's sorrows, but as I grew older, I began to see how they point us to the heart of her love and sacrifice. Each sorrow reflects not only her suffering but also her unwavering faith and devotion to God's plan.


The Seven Sorrows of Mary are moments of intense anguish for the Blessed Mother, yet they also serve as powerful reflections for us. They guide us toward a deeper understanding of sorrow and how we can unite our own pain to Christ's redemptive work. The sorrows include:

- 1. The Prophecy of Simeon
- 2. The Flight into Egypt
- The Loss of the Child Jesus in the Temple
- 4. Meeting Jesus on the Way to Calvary
- 5. The Crucifixion and Death of Jesus
- 6. The Body of Jesus Taken Down from the Cross
- 7. The Burial of Jesus

Reflecting on these sorrows helps us to understand how Mary can truly be a mother to us all, sharing in our own sufferings and leading us closer to her Son, Jesus. Her pain reflects her immense love for each of us, making her a model of faith, hope, and compassion in the face of unimaginable hardship.

While it can be difficult to reflect on Mary's sorrows, they offer us comfort in our own struggles. In Mary, we find someone who was no stranger to suffering, and as we contemplate her sorrows, they provide a path for us to deepen our faith and trust in God.
