It's beginning to look a lot like... Easter?! I received a phone call recently from Fr. Chris Trenta, who teaches sacramental theology at St. Mary Seminary. Our retreat in El Salvador was very powerful. Something that impressed me from this retreat was the powerful influence that Oscar Romero had on the society he was in while living in a very humble lifestyle. As the

Archbishop, he could have chosen to live in any rectory. Instead, he chose to live in a cancer hospital (which happened to be where he was martyred). He drove a simple car around and had a relatively small amount of people who

would assist him as he made his travels across San Salvador. His humble lifestyle had a profound impact, inspiring us to reflect on our own actions. He preached an affirmation: that God loves them and has come to save them. He was being Christ to those who were in need of



hope. After his martyrdom, someone who had very little faith during the time of the Civil War said she felt as if "Christ had come to El Salvador." Could you imagine if people could say the same about us? Imagine someone saying "Christ came to my home" or "Christ came to my work" when they see us. We don't have to sell people a product; we remind them that there's hope that can be found in our identity as God's child. It's freely given! *St. Justin Martyr, pray for us! Fr. Josh*

Making a Choice

My time in El Salvador provided me with time to reflect on the lives of St. Oscar Romero as well as Sr. Dorothy Kazel, Jean Donovan, Maura Clark and Ida Ford. For those of you who are not old enough to remember, they were some if the initial casualties of the

Salvadoran Civil War. The Catholic Church sees all of them as martyrs for the faith, becoming Christ-like by shedding their blood in violent deaths.



In the 1960's and 1970's, there were really two classes of people in El Salvador. You were either wealthy or impoverished – there was no middle class. St. Oscar Romero's life was not always spent with favor to the poor. He was educated in Rome and ordained and later became Bishop. By all accounts, his early priesthood was spent with the wealthy. Then Fr. Rutilio Grande was assassinated by the Death Squads and St.

Oscar Romeo's heart turned. At this point, he realized he either needed to side with the wealthy or the poor. In his heart, he knew the answer. It was a decision that would cause him to defend the poor and would eventually lead to his assassination in March 1980 while celebrating Mass.

As the violence began to escalate, Sr. Dorothy Kazel was given the opportunity to return back to the safety of her native Cleveland but chose to stay. She could not bear to leave the people she loved to suffer and die alone. She stayed with the people. Like Jesus, who chose to preach



and teach even though it would anger all those around him and call for his crucifixion, Sr. Dorothy Kazel's choice to stay would lead to a similar violent death. Like Christ, she shed her blood for the people she loved.

There is a very good chance that none of our lives will lead to martyrdom. We will probably not die violent deaths for our faith. We do, however, have to make choices every day. In our choices, we can ask ourselves, is this what God has planned for me? Am I following my own will or God's will? St. Oscar Romero and Sr. Dorothy Kazel dismissed their own will and followed God's will. We should do likewise.

holiday liturgies and various social events and offers assistance to other parish groups.





4. I can't receive Holy Communion, so why would I bother going to Mass?

Though the Eucharist is the central aspect of the Mass, it is not the only important benefit we attain from being at Mass each Sunday. Jesus is The Word (John 1:14). When we come to Mass and hear the Word spoken, we hear Christ. Our souls feed on this Word in a way similar to the Eucharist. We are nourished and we grow deeper in our holiness by being present at Mass. We go to Mass with a desire not only to receive gifts, but to give the gift of ourselves back to the Lord. Eucharist is a Greek word that means thanksgiving. When we go to Mass, we give thanks to God for all He has done and continues to do for us. If your heart desires, you can make a spiritual communion. Use this prayer from St. Alphonsus Liguori: "My Jesus, I believe that you are present in the most Blessed Sacrament. I love You above all things and I desire to receive You into my soul. Since I cannot now receive You sacramentally, come at least spiritually into my heart. I embrace You as if You have already come, and unite myself wholly to You. Never permit me to be separated from You. Amen."


We Remember, We Celebrate, We Believe...
