

Marriage Tune-up

Have you ever noticed that the only way to keep an older car running well is by taking care of it? If you don't stay on top of maintenance, that old car will start to break down. You need to check those rattles. replace the battery when necessary, and

inspect the tire treads before winter hits. A periodic visit to your mechanic can prevent you from getting stranded without transportation.

The same principle applies to marriage. You need to keep it "tuned up" to ensure it continues running smoothly. No marriage is perfect, including my own. There are times when we don't communicate as well as we should, and we're still adjusting to our newly emptied nest. But we keep working on our relationship to keep it strong.

You may have seen advertisements in the bulletin for the Marriage Enrichment team.

We've planned a couple of evenings that we hope will serve as a tune-up for your marriage. The first event is called "Adoration and Apps,"



planned for Saturday, October 12. It begins with the 5:00 PM Mass, followed by Adoration and a reflection led by Fr. Josh Cochrac. The evening will conclude in the gallery with appetizers. Everyone is invited to bring an appetizer to share. Afterward, couples are encouraged to extend the date night with drinks or dinner elsewhere.

The next event is a Date Night on November 9 at 6:00 PM. We'll enjoy dinner and a talk by Neil and Nellie Krawczynski on "Intimacy in Marriage." Couples will sit in groups for a familystyle dinner and the presentation. While details are still being finalized, we're working to keep costs reasonable, so please ensure that this is on your calendar.




