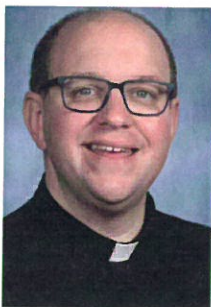

### Embracing the Deeper Meaning of Work

Few people love their job so much that they leap out of bed each morning, eager to start the day. For most, work is just that—work. As my kids grew up and began working, they recognized the drudgery it can entail. I used to joke that it's called work for a reason; if it were

fun, we'd call it that.

**Labor Day, however, invites us to reflect on the deeper meaning of**



**work.** St. John Paul II, the only modern pope to have been a laborer, understood this well. After working in a chemical factory during World War II, he issued the Papal Encyclical *Laborem Exercens* (On Human Work) just three years into his pontificate.

In this document, he emphasized the personal dignity derived from work, drawing on Genesis: "subdue the earth" [Gen 1:28] and "in the sweat of your face you shall eat bread." [Gen 3:19] These words were not just for Adam, but for all of us. St. John Paul II explained that every worker participates in subduing the earth—whether in agriculture, industry, or intellectual fields. He also recognized the often-overlooked contributions of women in the home.

The words spoken in Genesis were not just meant for Adam, but for us all. St. John Paul II goes on to explain that every worker in some way is taking part in subduing the earth. Not just agricultural workers, but those who work in the mines and quarries and the steel workers working at their blast furnaces and construction workers at their job sites. Labor also comprises intellectual work such as scientists, engineers, doctors, nurses. He also extended it to women who "sometimes without proper recognition on the part of society and even their own families bear the daily burden for their homes and upbringing of their children."

**Despite the toil and drudgery, work is inherently good.** It's more than a paycheck; it's something worthy of our dignity. Through work, we not only transform the world but also achieve personal fulfillment.

This Labor Day, as we pause from our work, let's remember its profound value. St. John Paul II reminds us that work is not just a means to an end; it's a path to personal growth and fulfillment. By embracing our work, we enrich our lives and draw closer to our true purpose.

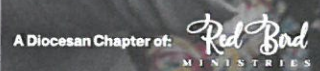
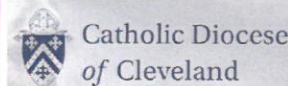


