### Thanksgiving for Prayers Answered

We often turn to God with prayers for our needs, but it's easy to forget to thank Him when those prayers are answered. Just over a year ago, while on pilgrimage in Medjugorje, we received the news that my niece, Hannah, had been diagnosed with cancer. At the time,

we didn't know many details, but we knew we needed to pray. Word spread quickly among the English-speaking pilgrims, and soon prayers were being lifted for her healing.

Fast forward over one year...to October 5, we celebrated with Hannah as she completed her last chemotherapy treatment for the Ewing sarcoma that had invaded her kidney. After four rounds of treatment, her kidney was removed, followed by three more rounds to ensure the cancer would not return. Today, we are overjoyed to share that Hannah is cancer-free!



We give thanks to God for the many blessings we've received during this difficult year. We thank Him for the doctors and nurses who cared for Hannah, for all the prayers many of you offered, for the perseverance and strength given to her by the Holy Spirit, and most of all, for the gift of many more years with Hannah. We are deeply grateful!

### Holy Name Society

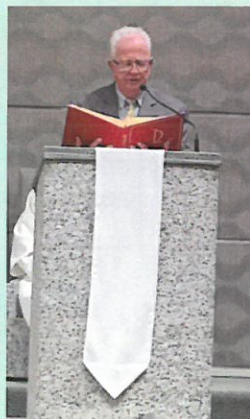
The Holy Name Society is collecting new white underwear and socks for the Cleveland Police Foundation who distributes them to various charities as well as those in need on the streets.

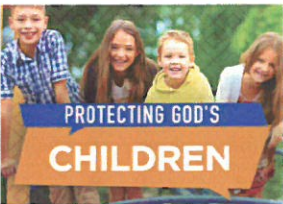

### 15 Excuses for Not Going to Mass (Answered!)

**7. There is nothing in the Bible that says I must go to Mass.** As Catholics, we believe that our faith and practices are transmitted through Sacred Scripture and Sacred Tradition. Underestimating the value of our Tradition and customs is a serious mistake. Participating in the Mass on Sunday has been and remains a moral obligation. The Book of Acts repeatedly describes the Apostles "Breaking Bread" on the Sabbath. There are many testimonies of the Early Church Fathers and other documents that provide us with clear evidence of how the first Christian communities gathered to hear the Word and to celebrate the Eucharist. Scripture also supports the Mass. A few examples: "Remember to keep Holy the Sabbath" (Exodus 20:8). "Then he took the bread, blessed it, and gave them saying: 'This is my body, which will be given up for you, do this in remembrance of me'" (Luke 22: 14, 19). In the Gospel of Luke chapter 24, the story of the Road to Emmaus is told, revealing the basic structure of the Mass we celebrate today.

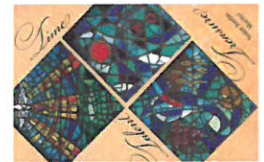

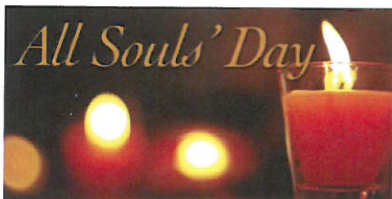

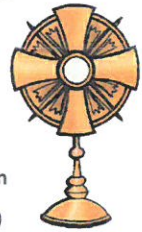
