This weekend is the final weekend we will collect for the refugees. It is World Mission Sunday, and we seek to live out the mission Jesus left us with.





Strengthening Marriages Together

Last Saturday, we held our first event for the recently restarted marriage enrichment program, and it was truly a blessed evening. The "Adoration and Apps," evening event gave couples a beautiful opportunity to deepen their connection not only with one another but with Jesus Christ present in the Eucharist.

The evening began with Eucharistic Adoration, offering 20+ couples time to focus on the One who is at the center of every successful marriage—Jesus Christ. By spending time in prayer together before the Blessed Sacrament, we invited Him into



the very heart of our marriages. Adoration provided a sacred space for each couple to reflect on the gift of their spouse, renewing their commitment to not only love each other more deeply but to love God together. Afterward, we enjoyed appetizers and fellowship, allowing couples to bond with others in the parish who share their journey of faith and marriage.

This experience is only the beginning of what we hope to build with our marriage enrichment program. A strong marriage is a vital foundation for both the family and the Church. When couples grow in their love and intimacy, centered on God, they naturally bring that strength to their families. Strong families, in turn, contribute to a vibrant, faith-filled parish community, helping to support the mission of the Church and pass on the faith to the next generation.

Our next event, "Couples Date Night," will be held on November 9 and promises to continue this focus on faith-filled marriage. Couples will share an Italian Dinner together, followed by a talk from Neal and Nellie Krawczynski on "Embracing Holy Intimacy-Including God in Your Marriage." This talk will dive into the importance of bringing God into the most intimate aspects of married life, helping couples understand how including Him in their relationship can deepen both their physical and emotional connection, enriching their overall marriage. The cost for the evening is \$35 per couple, and payments can be brought to the parish office.

We are excited to see how God will continue to bless our couples through this program. Strong marriages build strong families, and strong families are the backbone of a thriving parish. We encourage all couples to join us in this journey, as we work together to grow in faith, love, and unity, hand in hand with Jesus.






