school office at St. Justin Martyr! I look forward to welcoming them when the new president and business manager start in March. Pray for the success of our schools and for the future of our young children who will benefit from this work.

I am eagerly anticipating the Liturgical Minister Retreat/ Workshop this coming Saturday from 1 to 4. If you haven't registered for it yet, I encourage you to do so. This afternoon promises to be a transformative experience of prayer and reviewing what we currently do throughout the liturgy, enhancing our understanding and practice. Your participation can make a significant difference in our community.

I was deeply moved during my visit to Julie Billiart School in Lyndhurst in late August. The school's president (Lannie Davis-Frecker) gave me a tour and explained what they do at Julie Billiart and how they help those with various needs learn. One issue that struck me was



that many students don't come to Mass on Sunday because they aren't in an environment that welcomes them. This led to the decision to have a special Sunday Mass on Sunday, December 8th, at 12pm for those with sensory needs who might not otherwise feel comfortable coming to a regular Sunday mass. If you know someone in this situation, I urge you to encourage them to attend this Mass. It's a small step that can make a big difference in their lives and the lives of their families. We hope to make this a regular tradition if we receive a positive response. I want to thank those on the Worship Commission who are helping me move forward with this special liturgy.

Together, we can become a "beacon of hope" for those who might otherwise feel as if they are left in the dark.

Honor in the Everyday

When I look back on my time in the Navy, I sometimes find myself comparing it to the sacrifices of others who have served on the front lines, such as the Vietnam Veterans or those who faced combat. At times, this comparison

makes me feel that my own service was smaller, less significant. But the truth is, there is deep honor and purpose in even the simplest acts of service. Honor does not require big, dramatic moments—it can be found in the quieter, faithful actions that

happen every day.

In the military, and in life, these daily acts of commitment hold tremendous value. A routine maintenance check on a submarine, hours of training, or even the constant vigilance while on watch-each action plays a crucial role in keeping others safe and upholding the mission. Similarly, in our home lives, honor shows up in the work of raising children. supporting a spouse, or being present for others in need.

This call to honor also extends to the families who serve alongside us, especially the

spouses who often bear the weight of holding everything together back home. While we were away, they took on double dutymanaging households, raising children, and keeping family traditions alive. Their sacrifices are rarely seen, but they're woven into the fabric of what makes military service possible.

As we honor Veterans this year, We are reminded to celebrate not only those who have served but also the families who served alongside them, even if quietly and without recognition. In the end, whether on the front lines or in the everyday moments, the call to serve is always worthy of honor.

Catholic Social Teaching Month: 4 Weeks 4 the Common Good

Week 2: Preferential Option for the Poor

The extent of poverty is worldwide, and the people who hunger are making urgent appeals for help. We must take concrete action to encourage social justice among all nations and to offer less developed nations the means whereby they can further their own progress (Popularum Progressio 5).

Concern for the poor is a constant theme of the scriptures - a passion of the prophets, the witness of Jesus, and the example of the early Church. We are called to treat all people with

dignity and respect. The social doctrine of the Church provides principles for reflection, criteria for judgement, and guidelines for decisions that we must make each day. The presence of Christ in the poor requires the Church to make a preferential option for the poor and vulnerable. The principle of solidarity reminds us that we are member of one family and neighbors to each others. Our faith gives us the strength to continue, as a Church, to put into action the call to be Christ to others.



11. "Germs and handshakes, I just can't handle the physical contact with all those people." The Mass is the summit of a community coming into total communion, forming one Mystical Body. Here everything is brought together, body, soul and spirit. Everything is unified in Christ, Head of the Body. When we physically connect with others, we look to see the face of Christ in them. Father Hurtado said, "With the sacrifice of Christ, was born a new race, a race that will be Christ on earth until the end of the world. Men who receive Christ become Him." We all come together to form a single body of Christ, and in doing this, we live His life, carrying out His mission. This theology might not help you if you are a "germaphobe." If you still don't want to shake the hands of your brothers and sisters in Christ, pack some hand sanitizer for use after the Sign of Peace. Think of this as a small sacrifice that you make in order to be with the Lord and receive Him fully in the Eucharist. "I see Jesus in every human being. I say to myself, this is hungry Jesus, I must feed him. This is sick Jesus. This one has leprosy or gangrene: I must wash him and tend to him. I serve because I love Jesus." - Mother Teresa





The Avilas of St. Justin Martyr Parish

"There is but one road which reaches God and that is PRAYER, if anyone shows you another, you are being deceived." -- St. Teresa of Avila

Following in St. Teresa of Avila's spirit and under her patronage, the Avilas of the Diocese of Cleveland were formed in 1971. The Avilas are a diocesan organization of men and women whose apostolate is PRAYER for new vocations to the vowed and ordained ways of life, and for the perseverance of those who have already made that commitment.

The St. Justin Martyr Avilas group was started in November of 2000. We meet in the chapel of St. Justin Martyr on the first Thursday of every month. We begin with Mass together and after mass we share a Holy Hour in front of the Blessed Sacrament which includes prayer, reading and the rosary for vocations.

Since the Avilas began at St. Justin Martyr, we have had three priests ordained from the parish. Rev. John Chrysostom Kozlowski (Matthew Kozlowski) was ordained a priest for the Dominican Order of Preachers on May 28, 2010. Rev. Christopher Cox was ordained on May 17, 2017, and Rev. Kevin Fox was ordained on May 18, 2019, both for the Diocese of Cleveland. Rev. James Roach was the first priest ordained from our parish for the Diocese of Cleveland on May 29, 1988. He had been on a long sabbatical and returned to active duty after the Avilas began their ministry at St. Justin.

The Avilas began praying for a Deacon for our parish and in May 2015 our prayers were answered when Bishop Lennon assigned Deacon Tim Shell to our parish. The Avilas began praying for our new pastor when Fr. Kevin Liebhardt announced his retirement and we couldn't have been assigned a more wonderful administrator, our Fr. Josh Cochrac. After hearing Seminarian Joshua Stec and his request for prayer support for him and his fellow seminarians this past Priesthood Sunday, our St. Justin Martyr Avila group would like to invite YOU to join in active prayer for those in formation and those already ordained.

Please join us once a month for prayer. You will receive the prayers in an email or text in case you cannot make the Holy Hour a particular month so that you can pray at home. *Our next Avilas Holy Hour will be Thursday, December 5.* Start advent off right with a new devotion to prayer for those who God has called to lead our church.

CATHOLIC CAMPAIGN FOR HUMAN DEVELOPMENT WORKING ON THE MARGINS

he Catholic Church teaches the fundamental importance of paying workers a living wage that allows them to meet their basic needs. Cooperative businesses are co-owned by the employees, which gives workers greater say in how the business is run, including the wages and salaries that workers earn. Those principles animate the work of the organizations creating opportunities and fighting poverty with support from the Catholic Campaign for Human Development (CCHD).


Seed Commons is a New York City-based national network of community loan funds that make cooperative businesses easier to start and less expensive than obtaining bank loans. Based on a "nonextractive" model, Seed Commons does not require borrowers to make payments on interest or principal until they can cover operating expenses, including market-rate salaries. With support from CCHD, Seed Commons helps workers become

cooperative owners who earn living wages at companies like a Chicago-based window manufacturer, which pays \$2/hour more than it did before it became a cooperative. The employee-owners now earn not only higher wages but profit-sharing checks as well.


Your support of CCHD helps workers become worker-owners who earn living wages and establish economic roots in communities that badly need greater employment and earning opportunities. When you give to the CCHD collection, you help not only national networks like Seed Commons but also organizations working to end poverty within your diocese, where 25% of your contribution stays to create opportunities in your own neighborhood.
